The first week of January marks the beginning of Holmes SWCD's 2024 tree sale. This year's sale will run through **March 8, 2024**. A variety of coniferous, deciduous, and ornamental tree seedlings are available at reasonable prices. Whether you are looking to replenish your forest, create wildlife habitats or beautify your landscaping, a diverse seedling selection is available to help you meet your goals.

Last year, Holmes SWCD had a record breaking year, having sold, delivered, or planted **14,925 trees**. Let's make 2024 another banner year for planting trees in Holmes County! New Year, No Mud

Dealing with mud in the winter months can be a significant challenge for livestock managers. Mud can make even a simple task such as feeding, a time-consuming and miserable endeavor. There are several

effective ways to beat the mud and mitigate it's impact on livestock. These include:

- Identifying Drainage Patterns: Identifying drainage patterns and where water is naturally traveling and ponding.
- Maximizing Location: Directing water away from hightraffic areas (animal feed feeding and watering area, etc.) and away from bodies of water or other drainage areas.
- 3) Designing Infrastructure: A heavy use pad can range from a roofed, concrete pad to an unroofed, gravel pad. A gravel access road minimizes soil erosion and compaction and allows for ease of feeding. Geotextile fabric underneath good quality limestone is imperative to have a long-lasting and durable road for years to come.

Developing and designing this new system can seem overwhelming and insurmountable, but Holmes SWCD and NRCS are able to help with ideas, standards, and designs.

The Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP) is always accepting new applications, but the current funding batching date was recently announced as February 16th. This will be the deadline for your project to be considered for this year's funding. This program is a great opportunity to receive cost share funding to help make these practices possible for your operation. Cover Crop Wrap-Up

Holmes County is one of the 18 counties that participates in Muskingum Watershed Conservancy District's cover-crop cost-share program. Local farmers - in partnership with Holmes SWCD - had another outstanding year, seeding over 2,000 acres of cover crop, aerially, while submitting another 4,500 acres for drilled cost share funding. This year's program once again highlighted how farmers in Holmes County prioritize soil health by investing in cover cops. Although work for the 2023 program just finished, Holmes SWCD staff are already looking forward to what we can achieve together through the cost-share program in 2024!
